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Attorney General Pam Bondi Urges Anthem Customers to Monitor Credit in Wake of Data Breach

TALLAHASSEE, Fla.—Attorney General Pam Bondi urges all Floridians who are customers of Anthem, Inc. to take extra measures in monitoring their credit. Anthem announced this week that their computer network was the target of external criminal cyber-attacks. Amerigroup Corporation which is affiliated with Anthem and manages publicly funded health programs was also affected by the data breach.

The hackers reportedly gained access up to 80 million customers' records including, member ID/social security numbers, names, dates of birth, addresses, phone numbers, email addresses and employment information. Anthem has stated that the stolen data does not include personal financial or health information.

"All Floridians who received references or services from physicians affiliated with Anthem or Amerigroup in the last five years are advised to review their credit reports and accounts for possible unauthorized activity," said Attorney General Pam Bondi.
